



From Drafting to Negotiation: An Advanced Course in Contract Management (10 Days)

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Overview

Sound commercial agreements form the backbone of sustainable business partnerships, financial stability, and operational risk mitigation. This ten-day programme in contract management equips professionals with the core disciplines required to structure, draft, negotiate, and administer agreements with precision. Participants examine statutory fundamentals, commercial contract drafting protocols, risk allocation frameworks, and evidence-based bargaining methods. The curriculum spans post-award administration, compliance monitoring, dispute mitigation, and emerging automated workflows. Practical exercises and simulated negotiations enable delegates to transform legal and commercial requirements into enforceable contract architecture. - Emerging smart contract mechanisms and automated verification workflows

Day 3: Negotiation Strategies for Commercial Agreements

- Preparation protocols: identifying bargaining positions, trade-offs, and fallback positions
- Persuasion psychology and tactical questioning during competitive commercial negotiations
- Overcoming impasses through creative variable structuring and commercial trade-offs
- Managing multi-party and cross-border commercial negotiation dynamics
- Ethical boundaries and managing aggressive counterpart tactics
- Simulation exercise: negotiating risk allocation under constrained project timelines

Day 4: Managing Risk, Performance, and Contract Disputes

- Identifying contractual risk factors: scope volatility, cost escalation, and counterparty failure
- Service level agreements SLAs, key performance indicators KPIs, and milestone monitoring
- Managing formal variation processes, scope change controls, and adjustment notices
- Assessing breach severity: material breaches, anticipatory defaults, and cure periods
- Legal remedies: termination for cause, termination for convenience, and quantum claims
- Case exercise: structuring variation protocols to prevent dispute escalation

Day 5: Corporate Governance and High-Value Contracting

- Designing robust governance models for high-value and complex enterprise agreements
- Managing delegated authority levels and cross-departmental approval workflows
- Strategic supplier relationship management and collaborative contracting structures
- Drafting public sector and enterprise-level compliance clauses
- Contract handover protocols: transitioning from negotiation teams to operational managers
- Review workshop: assessing risk registers for major commercial contracts

Day 6: Financial Structures and Liability Management

- Financial clause drafting: indexation, currency adjustment, and advance payment protections
- Structuring milestone payment triggers, milestone retention, and letters of credit
- Cost containment protocols: audit rights, open-book accounting, and gain-share models
- Evaluating indirect, consequential, and punitive damage exposure
- Financial risk evaluation and lessons learned from commercial default scenarios
- Workshop: calculating financial exposure and capping aggregate liability limits

Day 7: Procurement Contracts and Supplier Performance

- Aligning commercial drafting with competitive tender and evaluation criteria
- Structuring service level agreements with balanced penalty and bonus mechanisms
- Ethical sourcing standards and modern supplier compliance requirements
- Monitoring sub-tier supplier obligations and pass-through warranty terms
- Managing operational defaults and supplier turnaround protocols
- Scenario review: resolving supplier delivery failure without terminating the agreement

Day 8: Contract Compliance and Governance Audits

- Designing contract compliance management matrices across technical and statutory standards
- Drafting data protection, intellectual property, and trade secret covenants
- Conducting internal and third-party contract performance audits
- Governance standards across public procurement and regulated utilities
- Managing non-compliance notices, rectify schedules, and audit findings
- Practical exercise: building an operational compliance checklist for enterprise agreements



Day 9: Dispute Resolution and Breach Remedies

- Classifying dispute triggers: specification creep, cost overruns, and interpretation conflicts
- Structuring multi-tiered dispute escalation clauses: executive negotiation, mediation, and conciliation
- Arbitration frameworks: forum selection, governing law, and enforceability under international rules
- Litigation risk assessments: determining when court enforcement is justified
- Evidence gathering, correspondence tracking, and privilege preservation during disputes
- Dispute simulation: resolving high-stakes warranty and indemnity claims

Day 10: Contract Execution, Renewal, and Digital Workflows

- Post-negotiation sealing, execution protocols, and electronic signature validity
- Change management and stakeholder onboarding for agreement implementation
- Tracking renewal windows, auto-extension triggers, and planned exit transitions
- Measuring lifecycle contract success using governance dashboards and audit metrics
- Digital transformation in contracting: repository management and automated lifecycle alerts
- Action planning: building a professional contract management governance roadmap

What are the most common challenges in contract negotiation and how does this course address them?

A primary challenge in negotiation is balancing risk allocation while protecting commercial viability and legal enforceability. The course addresses this through structured scenario simulations, variable trade-off methodologies, and objective clause drafting exercises that resolve conflicting priorities.
