What specific qualifications or prerequisites are needed for participants before enrolling in the course?

No prior certification is required. However, a foundational understanding of business operations or risk management is beneficial. This course is ideal for beginners and professionals transitioning into the field.

How long is each day's session, and is there a total number of hours required for the entire course?

Each day's session is generally structured to last around 4-5 hours, with breaks and interactive activities included. The total course duration spans five days, approximately 20-25 hours of instruction.



What's the difference between disaster recovery and business continuity, and why does it matter for the ABCP exam?

Disaster recovery focuses on restoring IT systems and data after a crisis. Business continuity encompasses all critical business functions, including people, facilities, and communication—not just IT. ABCP candidates must understand this distinction as it's foundational to BCM strategy development and exam success.
